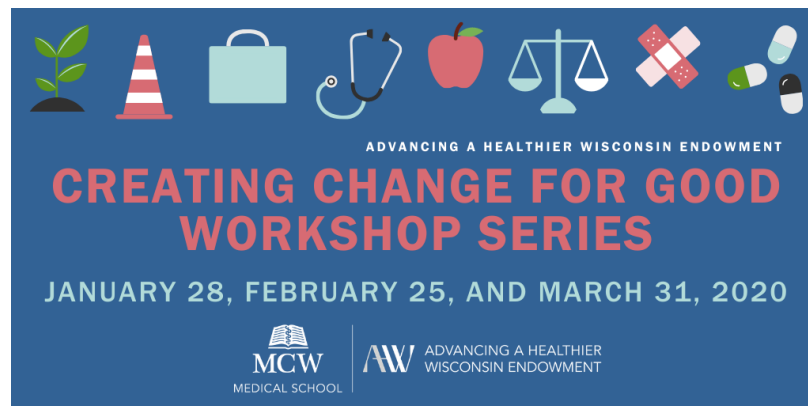

AHW Announces \$1.59 million in Awards to Advance Community Health Efforts Across Wisconsin

Funding brings AHW's support of health research and community health improvement projects statewide to more than \$263 million since 2004

The Advancing a Healthier Wisconsin Endowment (AHW) has announced its 2019 Policy and Systems Changes for Improved Health funding awards, with more than \$1.59 million being awarded to four projects aimed at improving health outcomes in Wisconsin.

Wisconsin Healthy Community Designation program accepting letters of interest through Jan. 17, 2020



AHW is excited to share the Wisconsin Healthy Communities Designation program, an initiative from the University of Wisconsin Population Health Institute's Mobilizing Action Toward Community Health (MATCH) group, in collaboration with diverse statewide partners. This program aims to celebrate local communities' efforts to improve health for everyone and serves as a guide for communities to enhance their community health improvement efforts.

Overarching program goals are:

1. To recognize local communities' efforts to improve health across multiple factors;
2. To encourage communities to conceptualize health improvement in this broad way and to structure their health improvement efforts accordingly; and
3. To promote cooperation across multiple sectors.

Communities that apply for and receive the Healthy Communities Designation will have a concrete way to acknowledge and celebrate their work to improve health in their community. The application process is designed to boost existing health improvement efforts by providing guidance on the types of strategies and initiatives that have been shown to work, as well as by encouraging applicants to increase the degree of collaboration among diverse stakeholder groups in their communities.
