AHW Announces \$3.1 million in Awards to Community Health Initiatives and Health Research Projects

Funding supports \$1.95 million in community initiatives and \$1.19 million in research studies aimed at improving health outcomes

AHW is proud to <u>announce the award</u> of more than \$3.1 million to five community health initiatives and six health research projects aimed at improving the health of Wisconsin residents.

"From cells to society, the Advancing a Healthier Wisconsin Endowment is working to propel work and ideas that support a healthier today, and for generations to come," said Cheryl A. Maurana, PhD, founding director. "Through these awards, we are excited to advance research that can improve lives and help partners create real, positive change in communities statewide."

The following community projects will begin their work in January 2019:

- Wisconsin Medical Dental Integration Project
- Using Food Hubs to Improve Community Health
- Building a Healthy Family Caregiver System
- Lowering Uninsured, STI & Unintended Pregnancy at Milwaukee County Health Departments
- Drug-Free Communities of Fond du Lac County and Fond du Lac School District Capacity-Building Award

The following research projects will begin their work in January 2019:

- Determining the Phenotype of Airway Collapse in Obstructive Sleep Apnea
- Targeting Cannabinoid Receptors for Neuroprotection of Parkinson's Disease
- Randomized Controlled Trial for Treatment of Clostridium Difficile Infection
- Neurophysiological Effects of Mild Traumatic Brain Injury
- Development of Predictive Test for Chemotherapy Selection for Pancreatic Cancer
- Mechanisms of Accumulating Damage from Repetitive Subconcussive Head Impacts in Contact Sports
