The Advancing a Healthier Wisconsin Endowment (AHW) is seeking qualified nominees to support its mission through a volunteer board position on its public oversight body, the Medical College of Wisconsin (MCW) Consortium on Public and Community Health.

AHW's *Call for Nominations: MCW Consortium on Public and Community Health* represents an exciting opportunity for qualified candidates with a proven history of health advocacy to join a volunteer leadership board that is helping to propel the most promising work and ideas to improve health and advance health equity in Wisconsin.

The successful candidates will be proven advocates for the health of Wisconsin communities as demonstrated through a nomination that additionally reflects understanding of and alignment with AHW's mission.

About the MCW Consortium on Public and Community Health

The Medical College of Wisconsin (MCW) Consortium on Public and Community Health, Inc. (Consortium) serves as the public oversight board for the community-focused investments of the Advancing a Healthier Wisconsin Endowment (AHW) and serves in an advisory capacity for AHW investments in research and education.

The Consortium was created by MCW to fulfill the obligations of a public oversight body as directed in a 2002 Order of the Commissioner of Insurance of Wisconsin (the Order). The board works to improve the health of the people of Wisconsin by executing both strategic and fiduciary oversight to support the stewardship of AHW funds in partnership with the Medical College of Wisconsin and in accordance with the Order of the Commissioner of Insurance and the AHW Five-Year Plan.

The Consortium is composed of nine board members: four members selected from candidates nominated by statewide and community health advocacy organizations; four members representing the MCW School of Medicine; and a final member selected by the Insurance Commissioner of the State of Wisconsin.

The Consortium engages in generative discussion; activates and advances strategic planning; and advises and comments on medical education and research initiatives supported by AHW. Consortium members are guided by AHW's principles of collaboration; transformation; stewardship; and equity, diversity, and inclusion.



About the Advancing a Healthier Wisconsin Endowment

The Advancing a Healthier Wisconsin Endowment (AHW) is a statewide health improvement philanthropy based at MCW. AHW propels the most promising work and ideas to improve health and advance health equity in Wisconsin today and for generations to come by investing in high-impact, promising work; connecting people, research, and academic medicine to break down silos and build up relationships across sectors and communities; and influencing how ideas and knowledge can become action to inform programs, policies, and practices.

AHW was established by MCW to receive a portion of the charitable funds from the conversion of Blue Cross & Blue Shield United of Wisconsin from a nonprofit organization to a for-profit corporation. The proceeds of the sale were generously gifted to Wisconsin's two medical schools – MCW and the University of Wisconsin School of Medicine and Public Health – on behalf of the people of Wisconsin.

Today, AHW continues to proudly call the MCW School of Medicine home. It is this strategic placement in the third largest private medical school in the nation — within Wisconsin's largest private research institution — that enables AHW to steward this gift by combining the power of philanthropy with that of academic medicine to serve as a catalyst for positive change statewide.

Since issuing its first funding awards in 2004, AHW has invested over \$350 million in more than 750 projects focused on health research, community health improvement, and health workforce education initiatives.

Consortium Board Member Duties

Members of the MCW Consortium on Public and Community Health board serve in a voluntary capacity to effectively provide strategic and fiduciary oversight to AHW's community-focused investments and programming.

Successful Consortium members will be active and contributing participants in the work of the Consortium by:

Regularly attending monthly meetings, typically held virtually and/or in-person in Milwaukee



- Thoroughly reviewing agendas, minutes, and meeting handouts
- Serving on standing or special subcommittees as needed
- Providing a fair and objective hearing to differing opinions
- Representing the public interest in general in addition to represented interests
- Conducting the work of the Consortium in accordance with standards consistent with Wisconsin public meetings and open records law
- Responding to the requests of AHW staff

All Consortium members are expected to fulfill the following roles:

STRATEGIC ROLE

- Inform and approve portions of the AHW
 Five-Year Plans that address "public health" as
 that term is defined in the Order
- Set community-focused program priorities and direction
- Inform and approve community-focused funding mechanisms
- Meet regularly to assure funding timelines are maintained
- Be an ambassador for AHW by recruiting new board members, reviewers, and grantees
- Advise AHW staff on community-focused programming to enhance stakeholder and grantee capacity building
- Amplify AHW messaging related to funding opportunities, resources and investment impact

FIDUCIARY ROLF

- Ensure effective stewardship of the community-focused funds for public health and public health community-based initiatives
- Approve an annual report of expenditures and program effectiveness
- Ensure compliance with its responsibilities under the Order
- Review and approve grant requests for community-focused investments
- Approve portion of fund allocation distributed through each community-focused funding mechanism
- Monitor funded project progress and results
- Advise and comment on community-focused expenditures annually
- Inform AHW operations

Consortium members receive no remuneration; however, expenses associated with attending meetings (i.e., travel and accommodations) are reimbursed.

Nomination Details and Requirements

The process to fill vacancies on the Consortium is conducted in accordance with guidelines in the 2002 Order of the Commissioner of Insurance of the State of Wisconsin (the Order). AHW is committed to ensuring a diverse pool of applicants for this public member position.

Eligibility Guidelines

Nominating Organization Guidelines

In accordance with the Order, individuals may not nominate themselves but must be nominated by an organization that meets the following eligibility criteria:



- Organization is Wisconsin-based
- Organization has operated for at least five years
- Organization is widely recognized as a nonprofit or governmental advocate organization that is independent of influence by Blue Cross & Blue Shield United of Wisconsin (BCBSUW), affiliates of Blue Cross & Blue Shield United of Wisconsin, the Medical College of Wisconsin, and the University of Wisconsin School of Medicine and Public Health

Nominee Guidelines

The Order also requires that the members of the MCW Consortium on Public and Community Health be representative from the following broad categories:

Community health advocate

A qualified, independent representative from among the following:

- An advocate concerning health issues of particular concern to a minority community
- An advocate concerning health issues of particular concern to senior citizens
- An advocate concerning children's health issues
- A representative of a non-profit or local governmental community health organization other than a rural community health organization

Along with the above representation, AHW is interested in learning about candidates who represent aspects of some or all of the following:

- Are experienced in and reflect the diversity of sectors that intersect with health improvement across Wisconsin
- Are knowledgeable about systemic health inequities
- Are experienced in all aspects of board governance, including fiduciary and strategic
- Are familiar with Wisconsin's health needs, including those of local communities
- Are familiar with different philanthropic approaches
- Have served in a leadership role in the development of a community initiative that has improved the public's health
- See value in communities and academic institutions working together to reach a common goal of improved health
- Can articulate the ways in which they see communities and academics working together
- Holds a vision for the impact that AHW investments can have in improving the health of Wisconsin communities
- Can provide a strong example of their work with diverse communities

Nomination and Selection Process

For the *Call for Nominations: MCW Consortium on Public and Community Health*, AHW is implementing a two-stage nomination process beginning with a nomination submission, followed by an interview stage.



Nomination Submission

Nominations are due by 12 p.m. (CST) on February 28, 2025. Nominating organizations must fill out and submit the <u>online</u> <u>nomination form</u> found on the AHW website. No paper or emailed copies of nominations will be accepted.

The nominating organization will be required to designate on the nomination form one point-of-contact for questions or additional information from the committee. Following the successful submission of a nomination, the nominating organization's designated contact will receive an email confirming submission of the nomination form. The nominee will then receive an email notifying them of their nomination and asking the nominee to confirm interest. The nominee will also have the opportunity to provide both demographic and additional information to the nominating subcommittee. The nominee is asked to submit this information within two business days of receipt of the email in order to move to the next stage of the selection process.

Interview Process

Candidates nominated to fill the public member vacancies on the Consortium who meet the basic requirements and confirm their interest (see Nomination Submission details above) will be reviewed by the Nominating Subcommittee and may be interviewed by AHW staff and/or the nominating subcommittee. The nominating subcommittee is composed of Consortium members other than the member who is vacating a position and other than the members appointed by the MCW Board of Trustees as Trustee representatives (Commissioner of Insurance Order, 99-C26038, section 2, (5)a).

The interviews will:

- Be conducted virtually, at the discretion of the candidate
- Consist of six questions prepared in advance by the nominating subcommittee; questions will be consistent for all candidates
- Last approximately 30-40 minutes, dependent upon length of candidate responses and time for questions from the candidate

Sample questions for the candidate (note: final questions may differ):

- 1. Why do you want to be a member of the Consortium?
- 2. We all have had various jobs in our careers, but generally have a core body of work. How would you define your body of work, and how would this appointment complement and extend your career record?

- 4. The position, in the category of community health advocate, represents a broad range of potential healthcare issues that may be improved through innovative funding strategies. Could you explain how your experience with your current organization supports the role and requirements of the community health advocate, and what skills you would bring to bear in your philanthropic approach?
- 5. Please detail your experience serving on boards.
- 6. Have you ever been in a board situation where two or more board members presented vastly differing opinions? How did you handle the situation?
